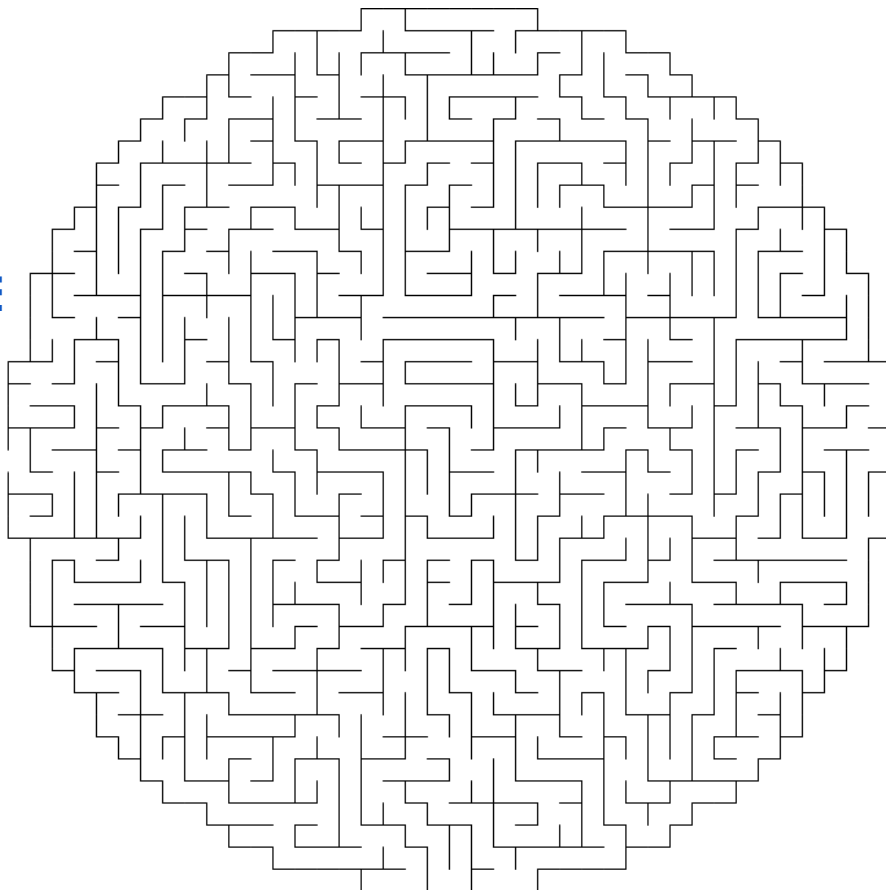
## Fun Facts
